SB 22 (2019) - Forfeits Delaware's Electoral College Vote to the National Popular Vote

This legislation was passed in Delaware in 2019. This law enacts the National Popular Vote (NPV) compact which has the goal of abolishing the electoral college process in electing the President of the United States. The law means that Delaware has agreed to a compact between states to elect the President based on the National Popular Vote, therefore bypassing the voting process as outlined in the Constitution of the United States.

Application: This law forfeits Delaware's presidential electors to the winner of the national popular vote rather than the state's popular vote.
