For select races, candidate positions are included based on voting records, public statements, and other credible sources. When an obelus “†” appears next to the answers of candidates who did not respond, it indicates that there is a record or a statement on DEvoterguide.com to help you determine the candidate’s position on the issue.

We recommend contacting the candidate to ask about his or her position on issues and assess the principles by which a candidate will make decisions on your behalf.
